

"I will appease him with the present that goes before me. Then afterward I will see his face; perhaps he will accept me."


Literally (cp. footnotes in the german bible):

- Only afterward I will see his face
 - Perhaps he will lift up my face (will "accept me")?

III. Jacob's fight with God (Gen. 32,25-33)

 - ✓ Weakness (V. 26)
 - ✓ Plea for Blessing (V. 27)
 - ✓ Self-Awareness: "I am JACOB"
- Blessing (V. 29-30)
 - ✓ Fighter w/ God: ISRAEL (V. 29)
 - ✓ God-Awareness (V. 30, cp. Judges 13,18)



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Gen. 32,31: So Jacob named the place *Peniel*, **for** he said, "I have seen God <u>face to face</u>, yet my life has been preserved." 31 Now the **sun rose upon him** just as he crossed over Penuel, and **he was limping** on his thigh.

cp. Judges 13,15: So Manoah said to his wife, "We will surely die, for we have seen God."

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Hosea 12,2: The LORD (...) will punish **Jacob** according to his ways; He will repay him according to his deeds. ³

- In the womb he took his brother by the heel
- And in his maturity he contended with God.
 ⁴ Yes, he wrestled with the angel and prevailed; He wept and sought His favor.
- He found Him at Bethel. And there He spoke with us ...

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 - already in chp. 28 (Bethel-ledder) Jacob had a first revelation of God, w/ blessings of salvation
 - but only here in chp. 32 (Pniel) he finally begun (!) to realize who God is and who he himself is
 - his life was not preserved (saved), before he did admit, who he really was in himself ("Jacob")

Elements of a true conversion (from this story)

- To realize that I stand before God always/only alone!
- To be robbed of all human means (to help myself)
- To understand that "atonement" & "reconciliation"
 a) are not given in our hands
 - b) are needed not only in "horizontal" relationships ...
- To recognise / confess who I am in my own nature ("Jacob" = tricker towards God & Man)
- To receive a new identity ("Israel")
- To become aware of God & self

The fight at Jabbok (the *letting go* of our lies about our life), as well as the *Realization* of who the Lord really is, is a picture of a true conversion of a person and the starting-point of true holiness

- Success in holiness starts, when you realize your self
- The most meangingful step in Self-Awareness ist to come to know God, how He is
- Self-Awareness / Realization of God, go hand in hand

I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me.
